Collegial Learning Homework	Homework is a great way to practice lessons, master learning statements, and exercise self-directed learning. Includes template for homework planning.
Collegial Learning Independent and Computer Based	Provides a template for planning Independent work and Computer-Based Learning.
Collegial Learning Student Directed Group	Provides a template for planning Student Directed Small Groups.
Learning Plan Grid	The unit plan aligns the curriculum to standards and benchmarks. The next step is to align the curriculum to instruction. This is where the real fun begins—teachers sharing their most successful instructional strategies for meeting each objective in the unit of instruction. Learning plan grids level each objective into three tiers—target, enhanced, and prerequisite. The learning plan grid also differentiates learning activities among various modes of instruction. Includes a template for a Learning Plan.
Student Learning Plan	Putting the plan into the hands of each student gives increased opportunity for self-management and self-directed learning. Just as the teacher’s lesson plan serves as the map for executing powerful teaching, an individual student learning plan becomes the student’s map for learning. Includes a sample student lesson plan and template.
Student Learning Report	In addition to whatever system you use to determine student grades, keep a simple Class Progress Chart to mark when you are sure a student has mastered a leveled learning statement, based on your examination of their work. In order to report to parents on their child’s progress in mastering objectives, you simply take that students information from your Class Progress Chart and record it on a Student Learning Report. Includes a Student Learning Report template.
